

## Points of Interest

### 1 Community Bandstand

On the Square  
*Site of many community events throughout the year, including the Concerts on the Square and the Blue Sky Concerts music series in May and September*

### 2 Decatur Railroad Depot

301 E. Howard St.  
*Built in 1891, the depot was a busy, important part of the life of early Decatur.*

### 3 Historic South Candler Street

*This Neighborhood was the first district in Decatur to be listed in the National Register of Historic Places. It includes fine examples of late 19th and early 20th century homes that were built by some of Decatur's oldest families.*

### 4 PATH Trail

Connects E. Green St. to Oakview Rd.  
*This trail, part of a 200-mile system of paved and on-road routes, threads through the Atlanta Metro area, and is designed for both avid and leisurely walkers, runners, cyclists and skaters.*

### 5 Oakhurst Community Garden Project (OCGP)

Oakview Rd. and S. McDonough St.  
*The garden serves the dual purpose of educating young people about growing flowers and plants, and beautifying the Oakhurst area. The OCGP is a 501C3 organization that welcomes members and volunteers.*

### 6 Old Scottish Rite Hospital

321 West Hill St.  
*This former landmark children's hospital, designed by noted architect Neel Reid, was the first Scottish Rite Hospital in the country. It now functions as a community and commercial center.*

### 7 Oakhurst Neighborhood

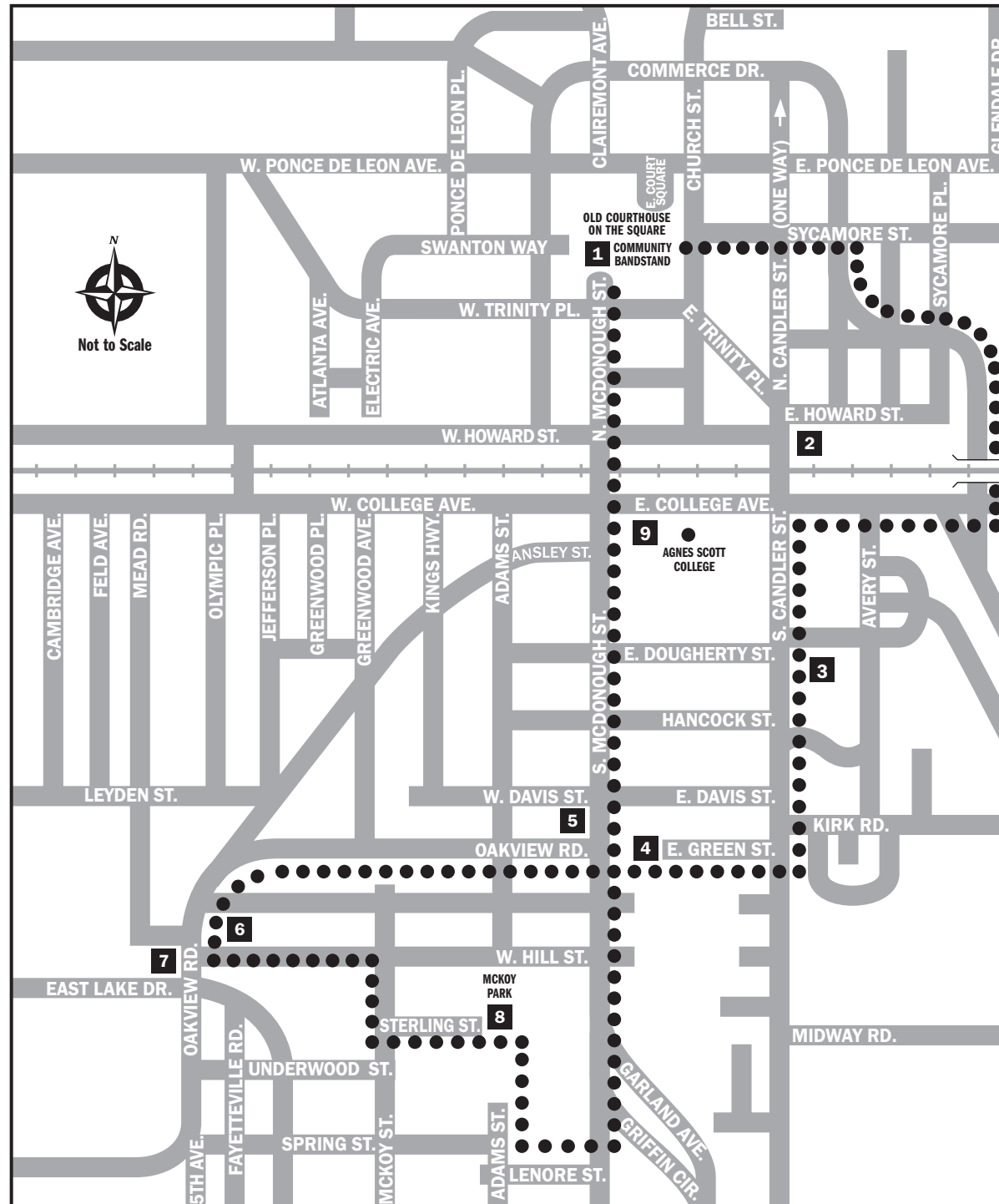
*This community of homes and unique shops and restaurants was once the City of Oakhurst.*

### 8 McKoy Park

534 McKoy St.  
*A Decatur Parks and Recreation facility. Amenities include ballfields, a swimming pool and picnic tables.*

### 9 Agnes Scott College

141 E. College Ave.  
*Established in 1889, Agnes Scott College is a highly regarded women's college, with an enrollment of 900.*

# Walking Tour

## Tour Directions

Beginning at the Community Bandstand on the Square:

- Travel east on Sycamore Street.
- Turn right (south) on Commerce Drive.
- Follow Commerce as it crosses under railroad bridge.
- Cross College Avenue to sidewalk and turn right (west) on E. College Avenue.
- Turn left (south) on S. Candler Street.
- Turn right (west) on E. Green Street. Follow paved foot path to Oakview Road (at S. McDonough Street).
- Follow Oakview Road west.
- Turn left (east) on W. Hill Street.
- Turn right (south) on McKoy Street.
- Turn left (east) into the entrance to McKoy Park at Sterling Street.
- Turn right (south) inside park and proceed to Adams Street.
- Turn left (east) on Lenore Street.
- Turn left (north) on S. McDonough Street.
- Cross railroad tracks to N. McDonough Street.
- Continue north, returning to the Community Bandstand on the Square.
