2022 Welcoming Business Award Nominations Are Now Open

he Better Together Advisory Board is accepting nominations through October 14 for its annual Welcoming Business Award. Recipients will be announced by the City Commission in conjunction with the City of Decatur's Hometown Hero Awards in December. The purpose of the Welcoming Business Award is to:

- Reward and publicly recognize leadership actions that create a welcoming and inclusive business environment in the City of Decatur;
- Encourage businesses to prioritize inclusivity as a "best practice;" and
- Publicize and share "best practices" among local businesses.

Award criteria include:

- Increasing accessibility for people with disabilities;
- Creating a welcoming environment for people who are historically marginalized based on race, gender, class, ethnicity, sexual orientation, age;
- Recruiting and hiring practices aimed at creating a diverse staff;
- Training of staff to be aware of diversity and offer welcome to all patrons;
- Creating an overall welcoming and inclusive environment while supporting public health in the City of Decatur by implementing necessary protocols during the COVID-19 pandemic;
- Anything else that creates a welcoming and inclusive environment.

The Better Together Advisory Board was initiated from the Better Together Community Action Plan for Equity, Inclusion and Engagement. The advisory board created The Welcoming Business Award to highlight those businesses who make equity and inclusion a priority.



This month offers more opportunities for the community to share thoughts on Decatur's efforts to re-allow duplexes, triplexes, and quads in city neighborhoods. Such diversification of housing types can go a long way towards broadening the income diversity of residents — a key goal in the 2020 Strategic Plan. And because these structures must conform to the size limitations of single-family homes, they can be integrated into the existing architectural fabric.


Community members are invited to a public input session to share thoughts and feedback on the City's noise ordinance. In January, a steering committee comprised of city staff and residents was established to review and provide recommendations to update the City's noise ordinance (library.municode.com/ga/decatur, and then search for "noise" and select "Article III" in the results). Through best practices research, stakeholder surveys, and community outreach, the committee is working to address noise sources such as lawn equipment, generators, construction activities, and music and events. There are several opportunities this month to get involved in the City's budget process:


- June 6: extended work session and public hearing on proposed FY 2022-2023 budget and revised 2021-2022 budget and 2022 millage rates.

- June 13: public hearing on proposed FY 2022-2023 budget and revised 2021-2022 budget (if needed).
- June 21: public hearing and scheduled adoption of proposed FY 2022-2023 budget and revised 2021-2022 budget and 2022 millage rates.

All public hearings are held in-person as well as via Zoom. 



Alair Homes Decatur Wins National Awards

After winning three regional awards earlier this year, Alair Decatur has been awarded two National CotY awards for its work modernizing a 100+-year-old home in Midtown Atlanta, near Piedmont Park. The winning projects were awarded in the categories for Residential Interior \$250,001 to \$500,000 and Residential Exterior \$50,000 to \$100,000.

Built in 1910, the historic home lacked modern amenities such as a primary suite, modern kitchen, upgraded bathrooms and a guest room. Alair Decatur preserved many of the historic architectural features while creating functional, livable spaces. The project team retained the original door hardware, front door, staircase, three fireplaces and layout (with some modifications), while using new materials to update the bathrooms and kitchens seamlessly, and add a new laundry room and guest suite. On the exterior, the team integrated a historically-appropriate, second-story front porch to enhance curb appeal and add much-needed space for the family to enjoy.





DHS Senior Shines a Light on Gardening Program

Decatur High School Senior Mara Jones has a long history with gardening that began as a toddler working alongside her mom Tamara Jones, coordinator for the Wylde Center's Hawk Hollow Garden. Mara reflects on the once-thriving DHS garden and the community of student volunteers who played a formative role in building the garden as well as stoking her passion for tending it.

Started in 2008 by a DHS student, the garden has endured some challenges over the years. In 2015, it was relocated adjacent to the Career Academy to accommodate the expanding school and parking area, however, during construction debris was scattered on the new area making the beds unsafe for use. Another challenge came when the garden was sprayed with herbicide, rendering it fallow once again.

In the spring of 2020, working through COVID mitigations, Mara restarted the gar-




den with help from friends and family. Over the past two years, the garden has continued to flourish, adding a native plants garden in the fall of 2021 where a variety of asters and columbine grow. Located on a shaded hill

below the upper parking lot off Howard Ave., the native plants thrive in the local climate and soil conditions, they also help retain water and are vital for the survival of insects.

In the Career Academy sun garden, flowers weave around the herb section, which is filled with lavender, rosemary, and basil. Food plants, including potatoes, garlic, and greens, line the other side of the garden where mammoth sunflowers tower in the summer.

Mara notes that the garden does more than connect students across grades, often Decatur residents pass by and stop to talk with students about their home gardens. Others reminisce about the previous garden and collect produce to cook at home. Currently, Mara is working with students from lower grades to pass along gardening advice that will help the next generation cultivate gardens that will thrive for years to come.


DEF Awards 19 Scholarships to College-bound Seniors
