

# Pedestrian Advisory Committee Remembers Dave Schneberger


his month, we acknowledge the contributions of Decatur resident Dave Schneberger who contributed the monthly Walk & Roll Superstar article for the Decatur Focus from 2016 until the latest July/August issue. Dave was one of the original members of Decatur's Pedestrian Advisory Committee (PAC) of the Active Living Board. In 2016, the committee decided to celebrate Decatur residents for whom walking or bicycling plays a central part in their lives, by designating one each month as a Walk and Roll Superstar. As a gifted writer and poet, Dave volunteered for the task, interviewing, photographing, and submitting an article to the Focus each month.



As one of those honorees, Ann

Abramowitz cherishes the memory of Dave arriving at her house on his recumbent bicycle, accompanying her on a stroll around her neighborhood in search of the ideal photo spot, and sharing stories about his life as he inquired of hers. Those who knew Dave admired his quick wit, which invariably added sparkle to committee meetings. On the monthly PAC-led walks for the community, Dave volunteered to serve as sweep (helping those at the back), and always kept the conversation going. Sadly, Dave passed away in July after succumbing to injuries sustained from a tragic accident; Decatur has lost an active and creative citizen. Join the PAC as they honor Dave on September 17 at 9 a.m. with a walk from Decatur Recreation Center to Sycamore Park where stories and Dave's poetry will be shared. ### **Construction Begins on Oak Cottage Court**

In early August, the City of Decatur broke ground on Oak Cottage Court as a demonstration project to spur more affordable, neighborhood-friendly housing in the city. The cottage court is a housing concept that calls for several smaller homes centered around a common green space. At completion, this project will offer six new singlefamily cottages, sized 700-1,200 sf, around a shared greenspace, with parking and new landscaping. City arborists are helping to ensure that more than 25 percent of the existing canopy will be conserved and new trees will be planted to improve the canopy.

While cottage courts have been allowed in Decatur since an ordinance passed in 2014, this is the first cottage court project in the city and the first collaborative housing project that will be held by the Decatur Land Trust, a non-profit chartered with preserving a permanently affordable community in the city of Decatur. The homes will be offered for sale to employees of the City of Decatur, City Schools of Decatur, and the Decatur Housing Authority. At the sale of the homes, the land will transfer to ownership under the Decatur Land Trust.

This project serves as an example of how partnerships create affordable housing, with the Decatur Development Authority working

in collaboration with non-profit developer Atlanta Neighborhood Development Partnership and general contractor Fortas Homes bringing it to fruition. With the success of this project, the City hopes to demonstrate an unmet demand for cottage homes and to identify and address any regulatory barriers that might be preventing the development of similar projects by others.

Work is expected to take about 10 months, and the sidewalk will be closed to pedestri-

### Decatur Fire Trains Residents to Stop the Bleed

The Stop the Bleed program trains bystanders to act quickly and stop bleeding long enough for first responders to arrive. The one-hour class covers how to recognize life-threatening bleeding, as well as treating a wound with compression, packing, and tourniquet application. Uncontrolled bleeding can occur in the home, the office, at school, or on the roadway, leading to 40 percent of trauma-related deaths. While Decatur first responders are on the scene of an emergency within minutes, a person experiencing uncontrollable bleeding may have only a few moments to live. ### **Decatur Fire's Green Tips for Fighting Mosquitos**

With climate change comes changes to the insect world, including more ticks and mosquitos. With this increase comes the risk of mosquito-borne illnesses such as West Nile Virus. When combatting mosquitos, it's important to select chemicals that do not harm beneficial insects like bees. Before spraying, consider these steps to help eliminate biting pests.

- Clear clutter from your yard; mosquitos love to have places they can
- Eliminate dead vegetation; pests congregate in excessive build-up of grass
- Avoid standing water in wheelbarrows, trash cans, and lawn furniture. And if you have a birdbath, change the water regularly; mosquito eggs must be submerged in water, even one bottlecap of water can hatch hundreds of eggs.
- Lastly, consider yard plants that repel mosquitos; lavender, basil, rosemary, citronella, and marigold are lovely additions to any yard and tend to keep mosquitos at bay.

### **Decatur Fire Hosts Community Engagement Contest**

This past July, Decatur Fire challenged its three shifts to come up with a unique event to engage the community. A-Shift transformed their wellness workout into volunteerism by spreading mulch at the nature preserve of Woodlands Garden, thereby improving an outdoor space for the Decatur community to enjoy. B-Shift, in collaboration with the Refugee Women's



Network, hosted a car seat event at Legacy Park, installing more than 10 car seats and giving away seats donated by the Georgia Chapter of SafeKids. C-Shift hosted bingo at a local senior living facility once a month to help residents overcome the isolation caused by the pandemic. In the end, B-Shift was declared community engagement champions for addressing both safety and equity. The friendly competition represents one of many ways that Decatur Fire goes above and beyond their duties to support the Decatur community. In the end, everyone wins.

### **Decatur Arts Festival Invites Original Artwork for Official** 2023 Poster

As Decatur prepares to celebrate its 200th birthday in 2023, the Decatur Arts Alliance, in partnership with the City of Decatur, announces a call for artists to submit original art for consideration as the official poster for the 2023 Decatur Arts Festival to be held in downtown Decatur May 5-7, 2023.

The submitted piece must be an original work and concept, and must portray Decatur and/or its community in any form or vision. New stylistic interpretations of Decatur, for example, abstract, contemporary works, are welcome, and all visual art media are acceptable (painting, photography, drawing, sculpture, digital, prints, fiber art, collage or installation) except sound and video art. The work will be digitally scanned and reproduced for the festival poster, and the work will become property of the Decatur Arts Alliance and subsequently donated to the City of Decatur public art collection. Submitting artists do not have to reside in Decatur but should be familiar with the area: its history, landmarks, and neighborhoods. The selected artist will receive \$1,500 compensation for the work and its reproduction rights, including the festival poster, shirts, and related merchandise. 
### L'Arche Atlanta Celebrates Ten Years in **Decatur and Opens Second Home**

In 2012, the Community of Hospitality, a faith-based social justice community, invited L'Arche Atlanta to launch its first home in the Oakhurst neighborhood of Decatur. Today the house is home to four persons with disabilities and five assistants (three are residents) and has become a cornerstone of the neighborhood. Many in Oakhurst are familiar with the sound of bagpipes that play from the home during Corbin's practice sessions, and Terry has earned celebrity status as one of the judges at the Mead Road Mardi Gras parade.



In addition to commemorating 10 years in Decatur, L'Arche Atlanta is celebrating the opening of its second home adjacent to Woodlands Garden. This new home doubles L'Arche Atlanta's impact, which now supports a total of eight adults with disabilities and employs 11 assistants. Together, this small community of people with and without disabilities shares in the joys and challenges of daily life. Executive Director Tim Moore credits the City of Decatur for supporting their efforts to expand services to a second location.





### Madison Avenue Derby Announces 2022 Beneficiary
