## Assistant City Manager **LINDA HARRIS RETIRES** After More Than 35 Years of Service

inda Harris, the original editor of the Decatur Focus and current assistant city manager of Community and Economic Development, is retiring from the City of Decatur after more than 35 years of service. Linda has worn many hats throughout the years and has been instrumental in the creation of many key projects including the launching of Decatur's first website, establishing the city's tourism bureau, the creation of the Decatur Focus, and the co-creation of Decatur 101.

Linda grew up in Decatur and still calls the city home. She started working with Decatur as an employee of the Downtown Development Authority in 1988 after graduating from Agnes Scott College. She was previously a freelance reporter. With the mentorship of Lyn Menne, Linda helped introduce communications to

> the City. She started by creating the *Decatur Focus*, the city's official newsletter, in June 1990 which combined *Around Decatur* (which was meant for residents) and *Central Focus* (which was geared towards business owners) to help both residents and business owners know what was happening in Decatur. Additionally, Linda bought the website domain for Decatur in 1995 so the city could start connecting with the community online. Overtime, Linda's responsibilities increased and she started coordinating special events in partnership with other organizations with the goal of fostering a sense of community and creating a safe, fun gathering

space downtown. In addition, Linda also started helping with civic engagement and tourism initiatives.

Aside from work, Linda enjoys spending time with her family including her four grandsons. She also likes reading, jigsaw puzzles, watching movies, and writing. One little known fact about Linda is that she taught aerobics for 15 years.

Linda has been involved in many projects and been a mentor to many employees, but what she is most proud of is her creation of strong city branding, the Decatur Focus, the co-creation of the Decatur 101 program, and serving on the inaugural board of the Decatur Book Festival. When asked what she hopes her legacy will be upon her retirement, Linda says she wishes that City of Decatur will continue to have engagement and communications as an integral part of its culture. We wish Linda a happy retirement and are thankful for her contributions to Decatur.

#### Jack Kittle Wins GRPA Volunteer of the Year Award

Jack Kittle, a long-standing advocate for Decatur's Parks and Recreation Department, was recently named Georgia Recreation and Park Association's (GRPA) Volunteer of the Year. His commitment to the betterment of Decatur spans three decades and has made him an essential asset in the community.

One of Jack's significant contributions was the organization of "Bright at Night" and the "Sunday Strolls," events designed to educate the community about Decatur's parks, art, and pedestrian safety while encouraging them to explore the city on foot. Jack has also been present at "Touch-A-Truck" and "Touch-A-Budget" events to share his indepth knowledge of the City and the Parks and Recreation Department.

He has also played a pivotal role in the recent Decatur Parks and Recreation Master Plan project, "Recreatur," attending numerous public input meetings and spreading the word to residents. For five years, Jack has been a dedicated member of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, serving as chair for the last two.

Beyond his involvement with the Parks and Recreation Department, Jack has actively contributed to several projects aimed at enhancing the city's well-being. He championed the transportation plan for the City of Decatur, advocating for safer biking and walking lanes. For a decade, he has been a vital member of the Bike and Pedestrian Committee, working on various projects to improve community mobility.

Jack's influence extends to projects like the East Lake Transit Development Plan and Comprehensive City Plan, further shaping Decatur's future.

In addition to his community work, Jack has served in various capacities at Decatur High School, including as the concessions chair and soccer scorekeeper. ## **Café Lily: A Decatur Staple** Celebrating a Longstanding Local Business

afé Lily, a restaurant that serves Mediterranean fare, has been a staple in Decatur for 24 years. It was founded by Anthony and his late father Angelo Pitillo in 1999, but what most customers don't know is that there are two additional owners: Katie McLellan and Sowmya Burugu.

While Anthony no longer spends much time at the restaurant, his recipes can still be enjoyed by customers. Katie McLellan, started working at Café Lily as a hostess in 2010 and was later trained as a bartender until eventually becoming a managing partner. She is originally from Florence, Alabama, but attended Agnes Scott College. Sowmya Burugu, Café Lily's newest co-owner, was born and raised in India and immigrated to the United States when she was 20. Sowmya works as an IT engineer full time while also helping run the restaurant. Sowmya fell in love with the restaurant as a customer and started working at Café Lily occasionally as



a busser and went on to help as a server and bartender. When the restaurant was on the verge of closing during the COVID-19 pandemic, Sowmya saw an opportunity to step in and become a partner.

Katie and Sowmya describe the food served at Café Lily as a collection of "eclectic" European cuisine. Often, people think of Mediterranean food as Middle Eastern or Greek cuisine, but their food is inspired by various countries that surround the Mediterranean Sea from Portugal or Italy all the way to Morocco. Their signature dish, pinchitos, is Spanish-inspired; chargrilled lamb tenderloin marinated in Spanish spices and accom-

panied by white sweet potatoes and green beans and topped off with salsa verde and manchego cheese. Another specialty offered at Café Lily is their salmon, which is filleted in-house.

When asked what has kept Café Lily open for so long, Katie and Sowmya credit their loyal customers and the strong personal relationships they have formed with them.

The women behind Café Lily say they want to provide customers with an intimate dining experience that feels like they are having dinner at someone's home. What they love most about the Decatur community is that they are friendly, down-to-earth, and always supportive of businesses.

# WALK & ROLL SUPERSTARS

Meet **Debby Pollack**, the December Walk & Roll Superstar. Debby and her husband Mike are residents of the north side of town along with their dog Sawyer. Their young adult children Max, Kate, and Emily grew up in Decatur.

In 2022, Debby was looking for an environmentally friendly transportation option to get to and from work each day. DeKalb Pediatrics, where she works as a pediatrician, is just over two miles from her house, and Debby

thought she would give biking a try. Her son Max, who regularly rode his bike to Decatur High School as a student, giggled and told her she would not make it five times. Debby figured she could certainly prove Max wrong, but she did not feel especially safe biking on the streets throughout town.

However, in 2023, a few things fell into place that changed everything. First, the Church Street "cycle track" was nearing completion. Second, the family took a trip to Germany and Switzerland, and seeing so many people riding around on bikes, often while hauling multiple children, was inspiring. Third, a fellow pediatrician (Decatur native Dr. Andrew Godfrey-Kittle) was commuting to work via bike each day. Finally, Debby had been eyeing electric bikes and went to check them out at REI. Known as e-bikes or electric assist bikes, they have an electric motor and battery to amplify the rider's power. Debby figured she could certainly make it to



work on an e-bike while using the city's new protected bike lanes, and her hunch was correct.

Debby has been commuting to work on her e-bike for the last several months and has found it to be a real joy. Debby likes seeing and greeting people on the street as she rides past. She feels much more connected to the life of the city as she interacts with her surroundings in a way that car travel does not allow. The new bike lanes are a big reason Debby's bike commute reboot has been successful. She still wears protective gear but feels so much safer on the dedicated bike lanes, which are removed from car traffic.

Finding bike racks can sometimes be a challenge, but Debby encourages others to try out the city's new bike lanes. Traveling on a bike offers the chance to see our town in a different way, and there is always more to discover and see. Debby's son, Max, says if his mom can become a bike commuter, anyone else can do it too.

#### Over 65 and Still Behind the Wheel? Older Driver Safety Awareness Week

December 4-8 is Georgia Older Driver Safety Awareness Week, an initiative that encourages those 65 and up, their family members and caregivers to be proactive about discussing safe mobility planning for transportation alternatives for aging drivers.

The mission of Decatur's Lifelong Community Advisory Board is to ensure that older residents are connected, healthy, and engaged in the community. Transportation is one of the domains of the recently adopted Age-Friendly Community Action Plan and specifically aims to promote driver education support for older adults.

Decisions about the ability to drive should never be based on age alone. However, changes in vision, physical fitness, and reflexes may cause safety concerns. By accurately assessing agerelated changes, driving habits can be adjusted, or other kinds of transportation can be utilized to stay connected and active in the community.

Another resource for older drivers is the AARP Smart Driver Course, the nation's first refresher course specifically designed for drivers 50 and older. This defensive driving course will help participants refresh their driving skills and knowledge of rules and hazards of the road. It may reduce chances of receiving a traffic violation or getting into an accident. There may also be a multi-year discount on auto insurance.

The course covers research-based safe driving strategies, information on the effects of medication on driving, preventive measures to reduce driver distraction, and other safer driving techniques and instruction. For more information, visit aarpdriversafety.org.

This year, the Derby funds also supported the Kyle Pease Foundation with \$3,000 to purchase a new race chair for a local 6 year-old to participate in triathlons, and seed donations of \$100 each to the Down Syndrome Association of Atlanta, Remerge, and the Wylde Center to support their work in the community.

Eighty racers and 50 creatively themed Derby cars participated in this year's "soapbox derby" style race. 

## AEDS and Bleeding Control Kits Available at Government Facilities and Parks

Did you know that all City of Decatur public buildings and parks have automated external defibrillators (AEDs) and bleeding control kits? AEDs are a vital component to CPR in the event of a cardiac arrest and can greatly enhance the chances for survival. Bleeding control kits contain a tourniquet, shears, compressed gauze, and trauma dressing. These kits are available for use with anyone who is experiencing life-threatening bleeding, since a person can bleed out in minutes. #### **Rebel Teahouse Staff Now CPR Certified**

Rebel Teahouse became the first business in the city to have Decatur Fire certify all of their staff in CPR and First Aid. This training included adult, child, and infant CPR and AED use, choking, bleeding control, and several other topics totaling five hours of instruction and practical skills. #### Decatur Fire Offers Kitchen Fire Safety and Extinguisher Use Class

According to the National Fire Protection Association, cooking fires are the cause of approximately 44 percent of all home fires and resulted in 470 deaths and 4,150 injuries from 2017 to 2021.

Decatur Fire will be offering a class on kitchen fire safety and fire extinguisher training on Saturday, Dec. 16 at 3 p.m. at Fire Station No. 1, 220 E. Trinity Pl. # Why Are Fire Inspections Important?

The ultimate goal of any fire inspection is to create a safer environment for all while preventing fire related incidents. The National Fire Protection Association Code 101 and the International Fire Code establish the guidelines, standards, and safety requirements of every structure. Buildings are inspected to identify fire hazards that may be present, and a common one is improper storage or clutter around exits. This could impede the occupants' ability to exit the building during an emergency. Stacking boxes too high in rooms with sprinklers can cause sprinkler heads to not distribute water effectively.

Fire inspections help identify and prevent fire hazards. They allow firefighters at all levels to become familiar with the layout of a structure and special considerations like heavy fire loads, hazardous chemical storage, and fire alarm and electrical panel locations they need to be aware of in an emergency.

## Recycling Tips for the Holiday Season

Decatur residents are encouraged to follow these tips for a more sustainable holiday season:

**Drop Christmas trees at Legacy Park** anytime from Dec. 27-Jan. 6 to be made into mulch for use in our city parks and greenspaces. Trees may also be placed at the curb for collection by the City's sanitation department, but these trees will be sent to the Dekalb County landfill and converted to mulch only as capacity allows.

**Wrapping paper** – both regular and glossy – can be recycled at the curb unless it has non-paper additives like metallic flakes, foil, glitter, or plastic. Paper with these additives should be disposed of with your household trash. Please ensure all ribbons, bows, and other non-paper items are removed from wrapping paper before placing it in your commingled bin.




