Decatur Youth Advocate for New Recreation Facilities

ommunity outreach and engagement are key steps in Decatur's mission to bring the community's vision for its future to life. Decatur is one of six communities in the United States pursuing recognition through UNICEF as a Child Friendly City. A critical aspect of the Child Friendly Cities Initiative is youth participation. Decatur strives to be a community where youth are encouraged to contribute to plans and where young people are given a voice in the decisions that drive policy and action.

When a group of Oakhurst Elementary students suggested an inclusive playground at Legacy Park, the City helped bring that vision to reality, providing a space that children of all ages can enjoy. In March, Decatur Legacy Park held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new inclusive playground, the first of its kind in Decatur with a rubberized surface. The sensory-rich environment goes beyond minimum accessibility standards to create play experiences that accommodate an array of physical and cognitive abilities. This effort was made possible by a \$145,000 community development block grant through DeKalb County with the support of county Commissioners Steve Bradshaw (District 4) and Ted Terry (District 6). The City of Decatur pledged \$114,000 in matching funds for a total project budget of \$259,000.

Also in March, the City Commission heard and approved a request from Decatur High students for renovations to McKoy Skate park. During the City Commission meeting, DHS Skate Club member Julian Berman shared reasons for updating the existing skate park, including the need for safe places in the city for skateboarders to gather and skate. The Decatur Skate Club is one of the only known skateboarding clubs in Georgia and has 15 members. With the support of

> Parks and Recreation Department leaders, the youth were given a voice in the design of the project, which resulted in a \$175,000 change order for more durable concrete equipment. The City of Decatur along with skaters will work with American Ramp Company to design the new skate park for a total budget of \$365,000. Previously, the City had approved a contract for \$190,000 after an anonymous donor gave \$200,000.

DECATUR RECOGNIZED AS TOP 20 All-America City

The National Civic League named City of Decatur among twenty finalists for the 2023 All-America City Award. Finalists were selected after a competitive review process based on the criteria of shared vision, civic engagement, inclusiveness and equity, collaboration, innovation and impact.

The twenty finalists are being recognized for their work to improve the health and well-being of young people, and, by extension, all residents. A primary focus is placed on communities that are authentically involving and welcoming youth in this work.

Each finalist submitted a robust application discussing the strengths of their civic capital — the formal and informal relationships, networks and capacities they use to make decisions and solve problems — and providing examples of three community-driven projects or programs that have adapted and transformed the community. Decatur's projects included the recently-installed Inclusive Playground at Decatur Legacy Park, the Decatur Youth Council, and participation in UNICEF's Child Friendly Cities Initiative.

The All-America City Award event and competition will be held June 9-11. Decatur was chosen as an All-America City in 2018 for its equity and inclusion efforts and the creation of the Better Together Community Action Plan for Equity, Inclusion and Engagement.

City Budget Process: Dates to Remember

Decatur's fiscal year 2023-2024 budget process is underway. If you want to get involved in the process, participate on these important dates (subject to City Commission approval):

- **May 15:** Formal presentation of the budget to the City Commission and adoption of tentative 2023 millage rates.
- **June 5**: Extended work session and public hearing on proposed FY 2023-2024 budget and revised 2022-2023 budget and 2023 millage rates.
- **June 7:** Extended work session on proposed FY 2023-2024 budget and revised 2022-2023 budget (alternate date).
- **June 12:** Public hearing on proposed FY 2023-2024 budget and revised 2022-2023 budget and 2023 millage rates (if needed).
- **June 20:** Public hearing and scheduled adoption of proposed FY 2023-2024 budget and revised 2022-2023 budget and 2023 millage rates.

All public hearings on the budget will be held in-person as well as via Zoom. Access information and meeting times will be published on the City's website at decaturga.com/budget. Copies of the FY 2023-2024 budget and revised 2022-2023 budget will be posted online beginning Wednesday, May 17. Hard copies will be available at Decatur City Hall, 509 N. Planning for the Legacy Park Track and Field

Tuesday, May 16, 5-8 p.m., Legacy Park

The City of Decatur and City Schools of Decatur welcome all interested community members to learn more about the proposed track and field at Legacy Park.

Breedlove Land Planning of Atlanta will lead the planning and design effort for the track and field, which was identified as a community priority in the 2018 Legacy Park master plan (decaturnext.com/timeline/legacy-parkmaster-plan). Breedlove is a landscape planning and engineering firm that is recognized for its expertise in design of parks and recreation facilities, scholastic site and athletic field improvements and storm water management systems.

The planned improvements include a new competition track and field facility, synthetic turf athletic field, lighting, field house or comparable improvements to the existing gym, and storm water management. Funding for the track and field will be provided jointly by the City of Decatur and the City Schools of Decatur Board of Education. Barring unforeseen conditions, the project should be ready for construction by the end of 2023.

An open house was held on Tuesday, April 18, at Legacy Park to meet the planning team and share ideas for the project. If you are unable to attend the workshop on May 16, there will be another opportunity on Tuesday, June 13, 6-8 p.m. in Hawkins Dining Hall.

Heath enjoys the freedom his skateboard allows and is proud that Decatur High School is the only school in the Atlanta area with a skate club. Heath describes skateboarding as a versatile mode of transportation. The students easily store their boards in their lockers during the school day, and when school is out, they are ready to hang out and have fun on their boards. When skateboarders run into their friends on foot and wish to join them, it is easy enough to carry their boards.



Lithium Ion Batteries SAFETY TIPS FROM DECATUR FIRE

Many devices are powered by long-lasting, rechargeable batteries. While convenient, if used improperly, these batteries can malfunction and result in intense heat and flame with thick, toxic smoke. To prevent emergencies, follow these safety tips from the National Fire Protection Association. For more information, contact Captain Gary Menard, gary.menard@decaturga.com

Safety Tips

- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery and charging cord that is designed for the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 105°F (40°C).
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of a Problem

Odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, or odd noises.

Battery Disposal

- Recycling is always the best option. Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash or in piles.

Charging an E-bike

Charge your battery in a flat, dry area, away from children, direct sunlight, liquids, tripping hazards, and in a location where the e-bike is not at risk of falling.

Car Seats for Refugees

In partnership with the Georgia Department of Public Health, Decatur Fire installed and distributed more than 20 child safety seats to refugee families as part of the Child Occupant Safety Project. Held at the Women's Refugee Network building at Legacy Park, many of the refugees were recent arrivals from Ukraine and Afghani-



stan. With a grant from AAA, Decatur Fire purchased child-sized training dolls for the installation program to demonstrate to parents how to properly secure children in their seats.

DECATUR MUNICIPAL COURT AMNESTY PROGRAM APRIL 15-JUNE 30

The Municipal Court Amnesty Program offers the opportunity to clear up any and all outstanding traffic cases with the municipal court.

What is the Amnesty?

The City of Decatur Municipal Court Citation Amnesty is a program for individuals with past-due traffic citations and/or active bench warrants to now appear to resolve their matters and avoid arrest on the warrant or other penalties. The Court will waive any additional costs that may have been assessed such as a warrant fee and court costs.

Why Amnesty now?

The Court is offering Amnesty to promote public safety through traffic law compliance and education, and specifically to resolve court cases that were not resolved because of the Covid-19 pandemic. Amnesty affords citizens an opportunity to clear and update their driving history by satisfying outstanding violations that may have caused or are in the process of causing a license suspension, if not properly and timely resolved. This Amnesty program may also help citizens avoid an additional suspension as many are unaware that failing to go to court when summoned can, and in many instances, has resulted in their driver's license being suspended.

The Amnesty program is also offered at this time to facilitate a new start for citizens wanting to drive legally and appropriately on Georgia roads, but need some support with the costs associated with reinstatement. This is that opportunity as the Court is waiving many the fees and costs that might be incurred with new charges.

Who Can Participate?

Any driver who was stopped by the City of Decatur police and issued a citation. **Note:** City of Decatur violations are not the same as DeKalb County State Court – Traffic Division violations. If you are unsure, please review your citation information or visit the Court.

When does the Amnesty period begin?

The Amnesty program will run from April 15 to June 30. Court sessions will be held Mondays and Wednesdays at 9 a.m. and Thursdays and Fridays at 6 p.m. Additional Court sessions will be held on Saturdays, April 29, May 20 and June 17, 9 a.m.-noon for Amnesty only.

For citizens unable to attend court during the week, the City of Decatur Municipal Court will be open by appointment on the following Saturdays:

- Saturday, April 29, 9 a.m.-noon
- Saturday, May 13, 9 a.m.-noon
- Saturday, June 24, 9 a.m.-noon

Please complete the on-line request form for a date.

How does the Amnesty process work?

STEP 1 Find out if you are a candidate for the Amnesty program. If you meet any one of these criteria, then you are a candidate for the Amnesty program:

- You have received a letter from the City of Decatur Municipal Court advising you that you missed court and need to contact the court to reschedule your court date, and you have not done so.
- You have an outstanding violation from the City of Decatur Municipal Court
- You believe that a warrant may have been issued against you in the City of Decatur Municipal Court for any reason such as failure to appear, failure to satisfy deferred payment option or probation violation.

If you are unsure or do not remember if you ever received a letter from the City of Decatur Municipal Court regarding a missed court date, etc., contact the court staff at 678-553-6655 or come to the court at 420 W. Trinity Place to find out if you are a candidate for the Amnesty Program. **STEP 2** If you are a candidate, come to the City of Decatur Municipal Court, Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. to pay the full fine from the original violation. **Note:** If the original violation requires a mandatory court appearance such as a DUI, suspended driver's license or no insurance, you must appear on a Saturday court date to appear before a judge. Alternatively, you must appear to receive a new court date.

Additionally, and only through the Amnesty period, you may complete the on-line "Case Amnesty Request Form" and specifically request a court date to insure an opportunity to address your case during Amnesty. However, should you specifically request a date that is granted, and fail to appear, your license will be suspended and a warrant shall issue.

STEP 3 Receive clearance and final resolution documents. After the violation has been resolved and the fine has been paid,

- 1. The warrant will be recalled (if one has been issued); and
- 2. The court clerk will give you documentation to submit to the Department of Driver Services to have your driver's license reinstated (if already suspended).

What can I expect if I do not resolve my issue during Amnesty?

Please be advised, a warrant shall issue for all outstanding cases unresolved during Amnesty, and will proceed through the arrest process prior to case resolution and/or license reinstatement, if already suspended due to Failure to Appear.

What are my payment options?

- Cash (in-person only)
- Money order
- Certified check (no personal checks)
- Credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover and debit cards with Visa or MasterCard logo, a 5% service fee will be applied)
