

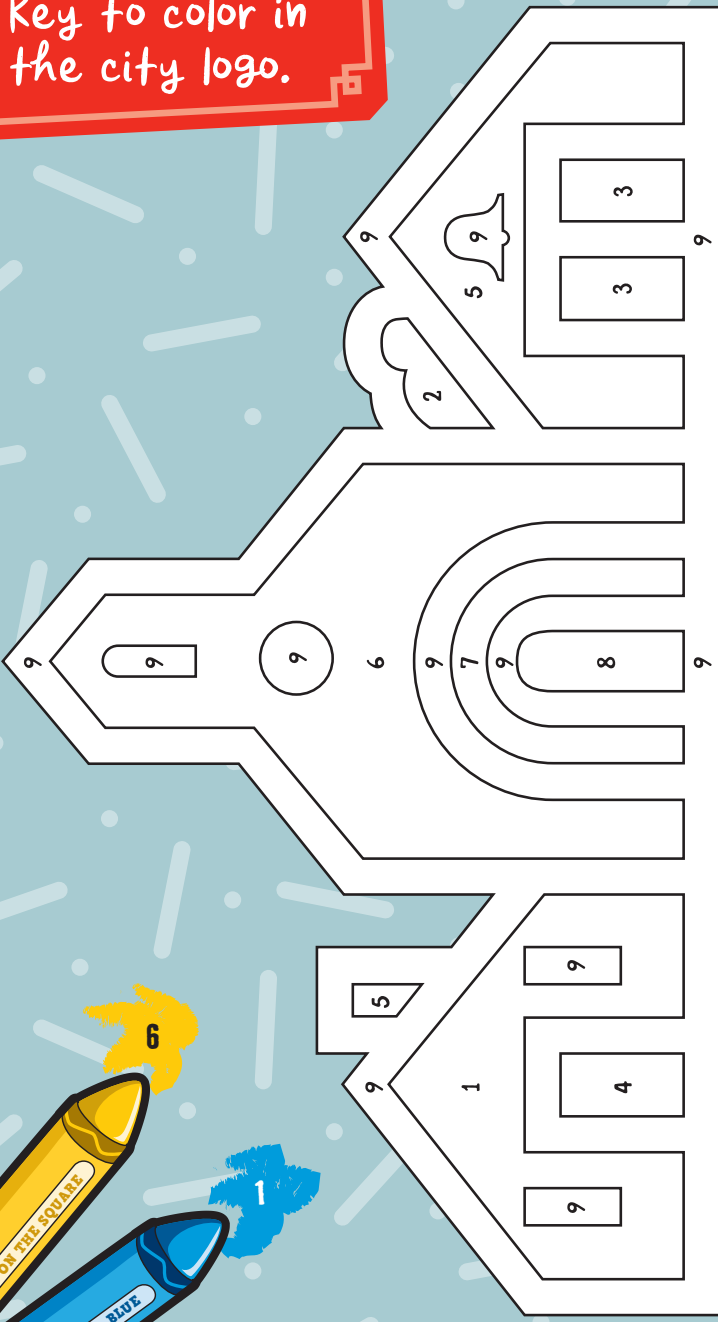

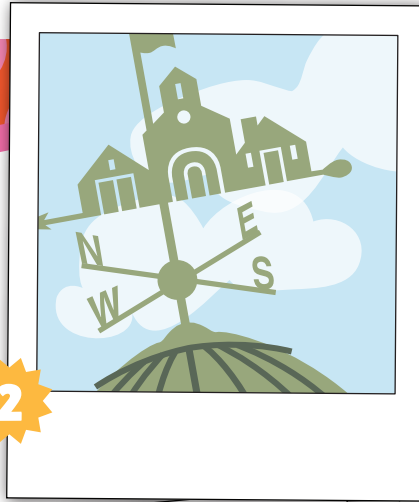

Got a Plan?

Every family should have a plan for emergencies like hurricanes, tornadoes, floods and fire. Does your family have a plan? Use this handy checklist to review it, or to get your family started.

CHECKLIST: Family Emergency Management Plan

Does my family have:

- Smart911 profile
- Tornado siren response plan
- Emergency kit with enough supplies for three days for each person in the household
- Supplies for pets
- Police and fire non-emergency telephone numbers
- Meetup spot in case of an emergency when the family is separated
- Two safe ways for each family member to exit from their bedrooms
- Escape plan from the house
- Safe place where family members meet if all must leave the house in the event of an emergency (mailbox, neighbor's house, etc.)

When you pack your emergency kit, remember your pets need to be prepared, too!

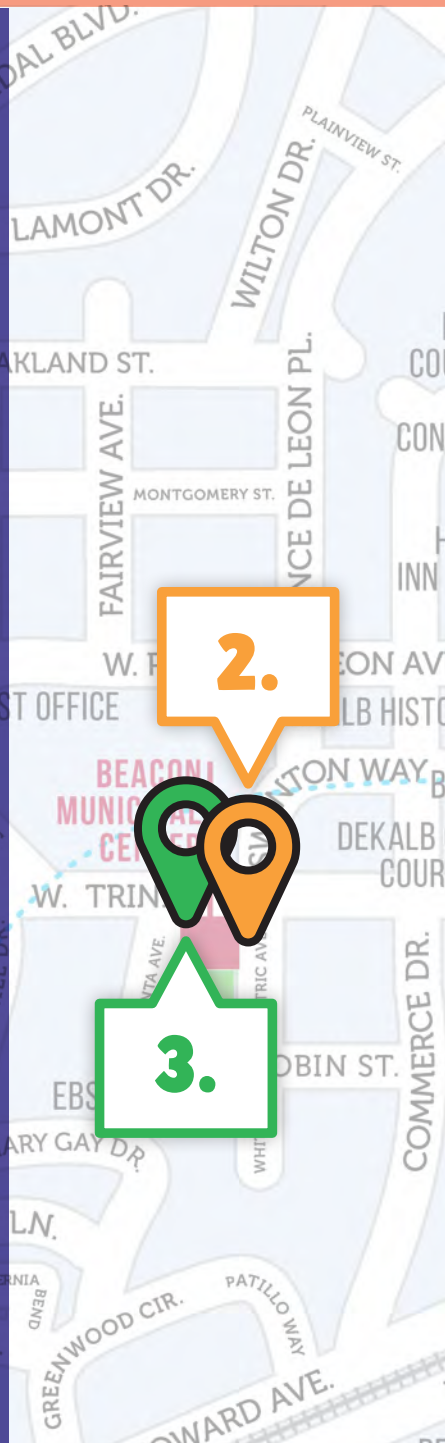
3. What's blue and white with a cherry on top? Where can you go to meet a Decatur municipal court judge?

5. Where can you apply for a job, pay property taxes, get a film permit, attend a city commission meeting or speak to the city manager, all in one place?

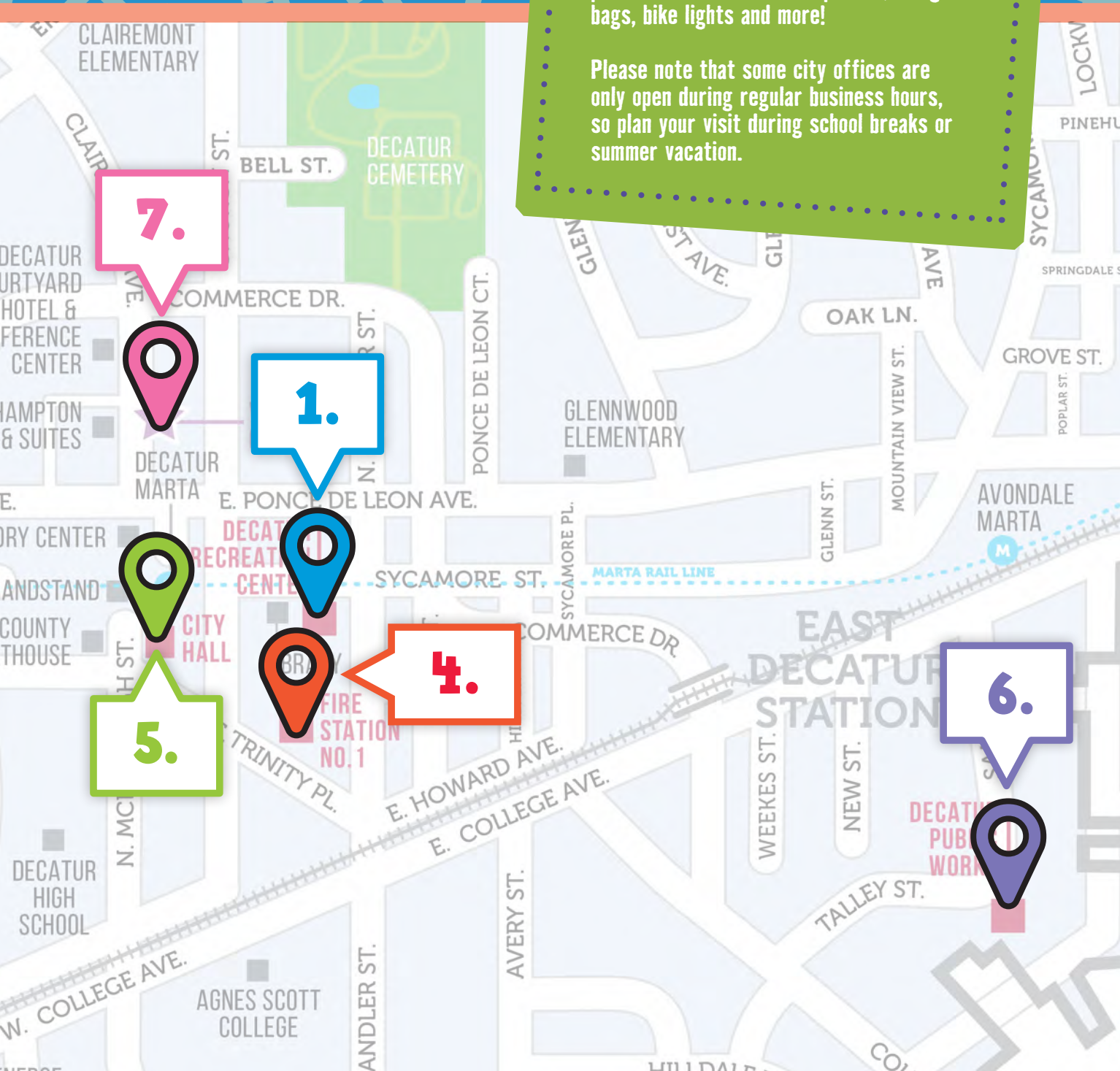
6. Where does Decatur keep its big street sweeper, mini street sweeper, garbage truck, back hoe, bulldozer, littervac, pickup truck and dump truck?

Please note that some city offices are only open during regular business hours, so plan your visit during school breaks or summer vacation.



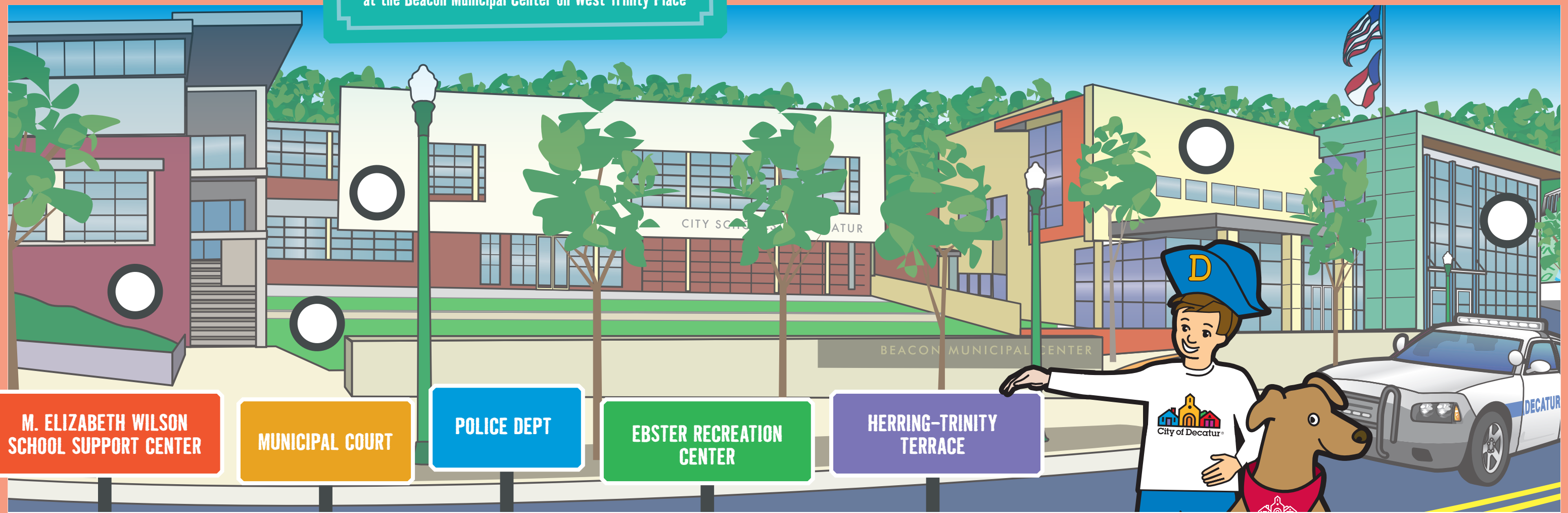
Beacon Hill Today and Yesterday

Major Beacon milestones

- **1830**
 - First census of Decatur reports 8,388 whites, 1,669 enslaved, and 17 free persons of color.
- **1865**
 - The Civil War ends, and Decatur's freed slaves settle in "the Bottom," later called Beacon Hill.
- **1902**
 - Rev. Allen A. Wilson opens Decatur's first school for African-Americans in a lodge hall.
- **1933**
 - Herring Street School begins teaching grades 9-12.
- **1957**
 - Trinity High School opens with Albert J. Martin as principal.
- **1961**
 - Baseball legend Jackie Robinson visits a standing-room only crowd at Decatur's Thankful Baptist Church to support desegregation efforts.
- **1965**
 - Decatur High School is integrated by 26 African-American students. Trinity High closes in 1967, and remaining students go to Decatur High.
- **1993**
 - Elizabeth Wilson, Decatur's first African-American city commissioner, is elected mayor by the Decatur City Commission.
- **2016**
 - Beacon Municipal Center opens on the site of Beacon elementary and Trinity High. A permanent exhibition documents the Beacon community.

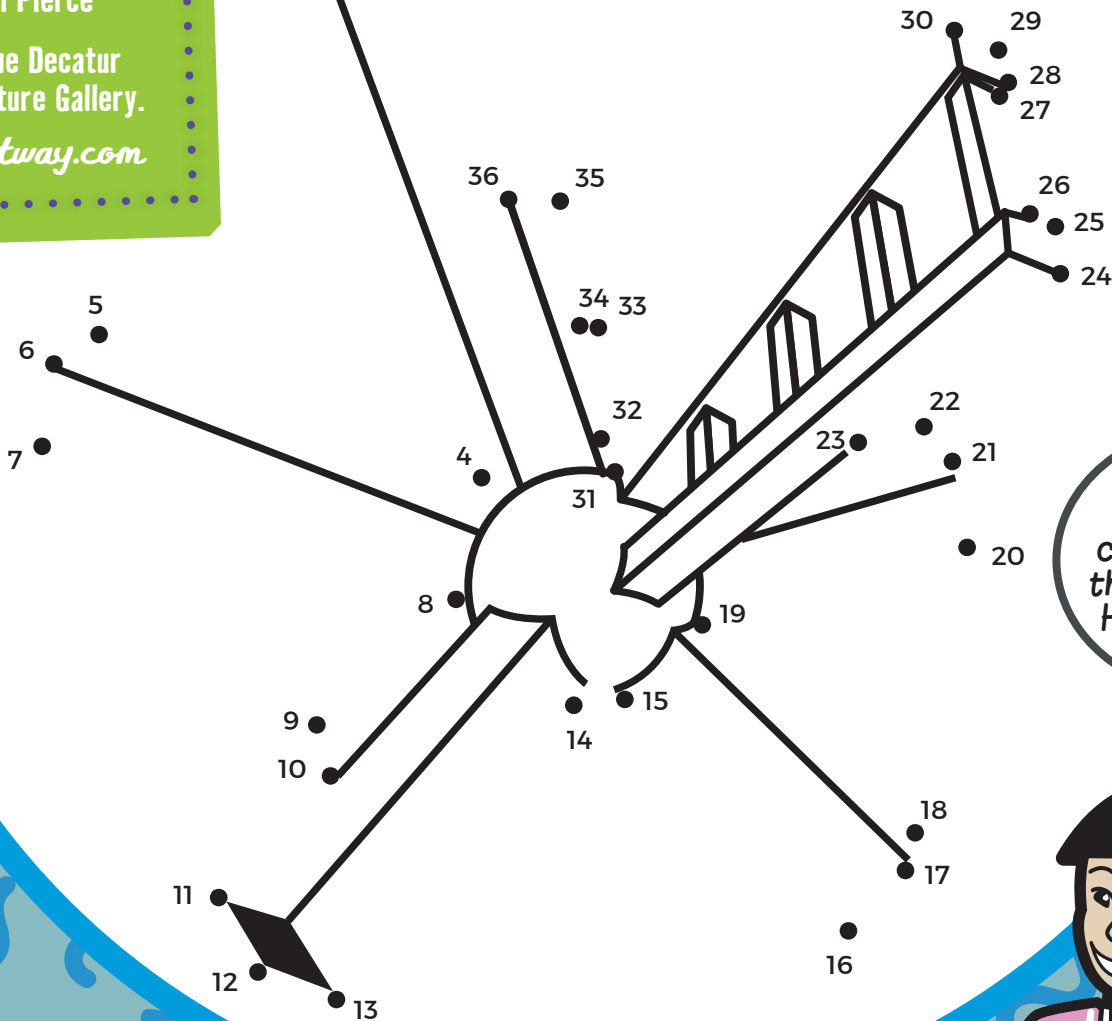
