





what is storm water?


When it rains, storm water collects in the streets, sidewalks, and everywhere else. As it flows through our neighborhoods, it picks up pollution along the way, and eventually makes its way into the Atlantic Ocean or Gulf of Mexico.

That's why we all have to help ensure that only storm water goes down the drain. Never use storm drains to dispose of motor oil and other chemicals, and keep drains clear of debris like litter and leaves that can clog the system and cause flooding.



garbage truck facts

- Can go up to 70 mph.
- Holds 13,000 to 15,000 pounds or about 7 tons.

street sweeper facts

- Has two steering wheels and can be driven from either side.
- Can only pick up debris if streets are dry.

recycling paper

- Using recycled paper can save lots of water.
- Every recycled ton of paper saves about 17 trees and 463 gallons of oil.

recycling glass


- Can be used to make new glass bottles, jars and fiberglass.



1. FIRE MARSHAL

Investigates the causes of fire and enforces the fire code; makes sure that buildings, businesses, and schools are safe.

5. DRIVER

Drives and maintains emergency vehicles.

9. FIELD TRAINING OFFICER

Supervises trainees during field training phase.

11. POLICE SERGEANT

Frontline supervisor assigned to supervise a specific group of 4-5 police officers.

13. POLICE CAPTAIN

One for each division: communications/special units/criminal investigators; Patrol/support services; accreditation, internal affairs, recruitment.

15. FIRE CHIEF

Leads department, sets vision/mission, manages budgets, staffing, operations for two firehouses. Takes command for large incident scenes.

17. MASTER OFFICER

Most senior officer on a shift, minimum five years of experience. Most are also **field** training officers.

19. ASSISTANT FIRE CHIEF

Also serves as the fire marshal.

20. FIREFIGHTER

Works to put out fires, provides emergency medical care, and maintains the firehouse.

21. FIRE SERGEANT

Supervises an engine company at Station One and leads emergency medical training on their shift.

22. INVESTIGATOR

Same level as master police officers, they investigate and solve cases.

2. OFFICER

Assigned to a shift, responds to 911 dispatches, interacts with the community.

3. INSPECTOR

Reviews construction plans for new buildings to ensure they're safe, and makes sure that public events meet safety requirements.

4. DEPUTY POLICE CHIEF

Oversees department operations, and budget; implements new ideas with focus on the future.

6. FIRE LIEUTENANT

Supervises an engine company at Station Two and leads fire training for their shift.

7. DEPUTY FIRE CHIEF

Oversees department fire and emergency management operations and training.

8. POLICE CHIEF

Responsible for entire department budgets, staffing and operations. Relies on all positions to help implement their ideas and views for the future. Similar to the "captain of a ship."

10. TRAINEE

Officer attending the police academy, also in the field training program.

12. FIRE CAPTAIN

Manages staffing, schedules daily tasks, and coordinates units on emergency incidents for their shift (there are three separate shifts).

14. PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER

Manages community engagement activities, educational classes, handles social media, and provides information to the public.

16. COMMUNICATIONS OFFICERS

Employees who answer all 911 calls and dispatch officers. Also keep criminal histories on offenders.

18. POLICE LIEUTENANT

Mid-level manager assigned to patrol team of 4-5 officers. Responsible for shift administrative tasks; reviews crime trends, ways to combat them.




