SAVE Affidavit must be completed and returned in order to receive an occupation tax certificate (business license)

The Georgia Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act of 2011 that was adopted by the Georgia General Assembly requires cities and counties to verify the legal status of applicants for Georgia "public benefits." Specifically, the City of Decatur must "require every applicant for such benefit to execute a signed and sworn affidavit verifying the applicant's lawful presence in the United States" (OCGA § 50-36-1(e)).

The State of Georgia has defined "public benefits" to include occupation tax certificates (business licenses), alcoholic beverage licenses and certain other government services. In order to receive your annual occupation tax certificate you must complete the affidavit on the back of this form and return it to City Hall.

The City cannot issue an occupation tax certificate without a completed affidavit. All applicants that fail to submit this affidavit must be reported as required by OCGA § 50-36-1(i) to the State.

As required by the State of Georgia through OCGA § 50-36-1(e), the City of Decatur must verify your eligibility for Georgia "public benefits" through the Systematic Alien Verification of Entitlement (SAVE) program operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security before a license is issued.

The above requirements are mandated to the City of Decatur by the State of Georgia. If you have questions or concerns about Georgia's Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act of 2011 or OCGA § 50-36-1, contact your state legislator.
