## The Community

The City of Decatur is a small, historic city located in DeKalb County, Georgia in the eastern part of metropolitan Atlanta. Despite its urban location, the City has managed to grow with the soul of a small town. It has a warm welcoming atmosphere and a focus on maintaining a high quality of life.

Founded in 1823, the City of Decatur has played a prominent role as the County seat of DeKalb County and the second oldest municipality in the Atlanta metro region. The City was named after Stephen Decatur, a popular naval hero of the early 1800's.

The City of Decatur was an early depot stop along the Western and Atlantic Railroad. Decatur's prominent place along rail lines continued to the modern day as the City grew up around the rail line.

With a central location in the County, a dense residential population, and a strong downtown core, the city was well positioned for heavy passenger rail expansion in the 1970's. The city includes three MARTA stations which have increased mass transit access to the city and boosted the revitalization of the commercial center at the downtown square.


In addition to public transit, the City supports a wide variety of alternative transportation options including walking, bicycling, and the Clifton Corridor shuttle to Emory University.

## The Community

The City has an estimated 2024 population of about 25,000 residents.

Some interesting facts about Decatur:

- 6 miles from Atlanta
- Decatur is one of a handful of cities in Georgia with its own school system (PreK - 12)
- Decatur is the county seat in DeKalb County
- In just 5 square miles, the City has 3 MARTA stations in its city limits.
- The Eastern Continental Divide bisects the City along the CSX railroad track
- 17 miles from Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport
- Median age: 35.5
- Public Art encompasses crosswalks, utility boxes, public spaces and is part of the spirit of Decatur
- In June 2023, Decatur was named an All-American City by the National Civic League in recognition of how Decatur is creating a thriving community through youth engagement










## City Government



The day-to-day operations of the City are led by an appointed City Manager (Andrea Arnold), who is supported by approximately 250 full time and 200 part time employees across nine departments.

The City General Fund budget for FY 23-24 is \$39,629,290. The City has a Aa2 bond rating (Moody's) and is a stable and fiscally responsible government.

## Departmental Responsibilities

#### <u>Engineering Division's Responsibilities:</u>

- Administration, planning, maintenance, construction management and technical engineering of the City's infrastructure.
- Overseeing the construction and maintenance of public facilities that are required for transportation and access to most properties within the city of Decatur. This is accomplished through design control, regulation and enforcement; and facilities construction, operation and maintenance.
- Operates the Stormwater Utility, which is responsible for the maintenance of the City's stormwater system. The department continues to work with the Metropolitan North Georgia Water Planning District to update environmental regulations that will ultimately lead to cleaner water flowing through our streams.
- Enforces ordinances regulating private development that affects public facilities, and provides information and limited assistance to citizens regarding grading, drainage and floodplain related issues.

#### <u>Engineering Division's Goals</u>

- 1. Provide the best possible public facilities at the lowest possible cost
- 2. Construct and maintain public facilities that are safe, convenient and attractive
- 3. Minimize degradation of the environment through enforcement of environmental regulations





#### The Position

This position reports to the Assistant City Manager (Public Works) and collaborates with a wide variety of departments on infrastructure projects.

Provides project management support and oversight to city-wide capital project planning and implementation. Projects range from:

- Improvements to existing infrastructure
- Creation of parks and open spaces
- Land acquisition and development
- Stormwater and roadway improvements
- Pedestrian improvements


The division coordinates project oversight and inspection with our staff members in Public Works, and provides project management oversight--design and construction through close-out--with our authorized contractors.

Ensures that stormwater programs are in compliance with Federal, State and local regulations. Position collaborates with engineering consultants in support of the City's drainage master plan.

Position also manages the City stormwater utility and interprets and enforces the City's stormwater ordinance and design manual.










#### **Key Challenges and Opportunities**

#### **Decatur Square Project**

The City of Decatur adopted the Decatur Town Center Plan 2.0 in June, 2023. The plan is the first comprehensive look at Downtown Decatur in more than 40 years. The 2.0 plan develops a new vision and strategic framework for the continued success of downtown.

The Engineering team will be working with other city departments, consultants, business and land owners and citizens to implement the projects adopted in the Town Center Plan 2.0.

These projects include a new stage/pavillion with public restrooms, flexible lawn space for events, redeveloped public spaces, water features and improvements related to public transportation.








#### Key Challenges and Opportunities

#### **Parks and Recreation Master Plan**

The City of Decatur adopted a Parks and Recreation Master Plan in 2022. Included within the plan are prioritized improvements to existing parks and facilities, development of new parks and open spaces, plans for expanding the city's trail recreational trail network and redeveloping existing parks and facilities.

The Engineering team will play a critical role in the design work and oversight of parks and facility improvements that will be funded over the next few years from this master planning document.














#### Key Challenges and Opportunities

#### **Storm Water Master Plan**

The City of Decatur has a storm water utility and invests funds from the utility to improve the storm water infrastructure through various capital projects.

The City adopted a Storm Water Master Plan in 2020 and the Engineering team is responsible for the design and implementation of the recommended projects listed in this planning document.

Decatur is a compact, vibrant city and the quality of life in the City depends on the Decatur staff managing its infrastructure to protect the local environment. The City is on the cutting edge of green infrastructure implementation.


#### Key Challenges and Opportunities


